On Sunday, May 2, 2004, the Middle Tennessee School of Anesthesia hosted a continuing education lecture/workshop for our current students and alumni on Difficult Airway Management. Randolph H. Steadman, MD, Associate Professor of Clinical Anesthesiology, Vice-Chair for Education for Anesthesiology, and Chair of Acute Care College School of Medicine at the University of California in Los Angeles; and William O. T. Smith, MD, President and Medical Director of Middle Tennessee School of Anesthesia, served as the lecture faculty.

Alescia DeVasher, CRNA, MS, adjunct MTSA faculty member, along with Dr. Steadman and Dr. Smith, conducted the “hands on” workshop utilizing human patient simulators and fiberoptic intubating scopes. MTSA is grateful to Olympus for supplying scopes and monitors, Rhonda King with Abbott Laboratories for sponsoring Dr. Steadman’s travel and lodging expenses, as well as providing dinner for the workshop participants. Paige Nelson with GlaxoS-mithKline sponsored the honorarium for Dr. Steadman.

The American Association of Nurse Anesthetist granted approval for up to 6 CE Units for participation in this lecture and workshop.

Several of the CRNA’s who completed the workshop said they would highly recommend this workshop to their co-workers, and would attend again if it would be offered again. Ruben Fernandez (Class of 1977) said, “*It was very interesting and it was great to learn a quick and easy way to intubate someone fiberoptically without any hassle.*”

Middle Tennessee School of Anesthesia is planning to host its next Alumni Weekend April 30 – May 2, 2005. We will again present a Difficult Airway Lecture and Workshop or a similar related topic.

We always enjoy having our alumni “come back home”. Our reputation is daily built by the performances of our graduates. New License Plate Recognizes Nurses in Tennessee

A license plate honoring the nursing profession is being offered through The Tennessee Nurses Foundation. The theme shown on the plate is *Nurses Touch Lives*. All proceeds from the sale of the license plate are designated for the Tennessee Nurses Foundation, a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, to help support its programs including scholarships, nursing research grants and nursing leadership development. TNF must sell 1,000 plates by June 30, 2004, before the actual production of the plate will begin. The cost of the plate is \$35, plus the cost of a regular license plate. TNF expects to sell the required number of 1,000 nurse license plates by June 30, but in the event that 1,000 plates are not sold, your full \$35 payment will be returned to you immediately. The legislation authorizing the nurse license plate passed the House and the Senate during the 2003 legislative session and was signed into law by Gov. Bredesen.

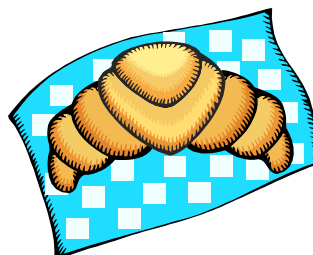

Split croissant and spread mustard. Arrange veggies on croissant. Combine mayo, milk and dillweed or basil. Spoon mixture over veggies. Add top half of croissant and take a big bite!

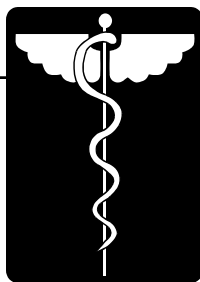
